FROM THE PRESIDENT

Celebrating change

2006 brought many changes at the Haven House as we welcomed a new Executive Director, **Angie Mayeaux**, and celebrated the career of **Beverly Wiener**, who retired after 23 years as our director.

Beverly's career at the shelter reflected her unwavering commitment to the needs of homeless families. With her leadership, we expanded programs to include transitional services to families after they leave the shelter and incorporated children's programs into our ongoing activities.

Our original location on MAC Avenue had four rooms with space for 12 people. In 1988, Beverly's efforts were vital to the capital campaign—co-chaired by **Dee Kinzel** and **Camille Abood**—that enabled us to purchase our current facility on Whitehills Drive, with seven larger rooms and space for 28 people. Today, we serve 100 families each year, offering a safe environment for families with children of all ages. Two hundred people attended BevFest, a celebration of Beverly's career, where Beverly received many tributes and gifts, including a gift from the staff of a portrait painted by local artist **Celeste Crouch**—a favorite artist of Beverly's, whose art is featured on many Haven House cards—and two garden stones, one for her garden, the other for the Haven House.

Visitors to the Haven House will notice the marker in the garden, recognizing Beverly Wiener as a director with a big heart and indeed, Beverly's passion for her work has made the Haven House a vital part of the Lansing area's human services network.

Visitors will also meet a new face—*Executive Director Angie Mayeaux*. Angie is relocating to the area from western Michigan, where she managed a facility for the Grand Rapids Public Housing Commission and coordinated self-sufficiency programs for homeless families. When members of the search committee interviewed Angie, we were impressed with her background and skills, but what most impressed us was her empathy for the problems faced by homeless people and her zeal for providing services to people in need. We are excited to have her leading the team that makes Haven House a unique resource in our community.

Our Mission:

Haven House provides emergency housing and support services for single-parent and two-parent families with children. The shelter helps families who are homeless prepare for permanent housing by developing and promoting self-sufficiency, stability and financial responsibility.

Resident Stories

Tracy is a single woman with a young child. She moved to Lansing from a nearby city to live with her child's father and his mother. Shortly after moving in, conflicts started to arise, and Tracy was forced to leave. She knew no one in Lansing, had no transportation and had just been hired for a job at a nearby store. Now she was on her own. She couldn't keep her job because she no longer had child care. She looked through the phone book and found several listings under shelter. After several attempts to get into Haven House, space opened up, and she was accepted. Once here, the staff worked with her on her immediate goals, which included securing child care so she could start her new job search, applying for temporary assistance through the Department of Human Services (DHS) and learning the bus system. She applied for financial and child care assistance through DHS, attended the DHS orientation and Work First program and contacted the Office of Young Children to get a copy of their confirmed child care agency list. Haven House provided her with bus tokens to get back and forth to her appointments as well as provided her with personal needs such as diapers for her child.

Tracy met with a Haven House staff person every day to go over her progress and obstacles. She was able to establish child care and find a job at one of the local fast food restaurants. While at Haven House she did a budget for the first time in her life. That was a major eye-opening experience for her. She was able to see what her priorities were.

After a little over a month, Tracy found a nice one-bedroom apartment. DHS assisted her with her move-in costs. In addition, Haven House helped her with cleaning supplies, food and personal need items to take with her to her new place. Upon her leaving, we also referred her to another agency that would continue to work with her on budgeting issues.

Frank is a single father with a 10-year-old daughter. A couple of years ago his wife died, leaving him to raise their child on his own. Although he struggled to make ends meet, he managed to keep things together until he was laid off from his job. He searched and searched but could not find employment that he was qualified for. Eventually, he was evicted from his apartment for non payment of rent. He and his daughter had nowhere to go.

He was referred to Haven House by a friend. When he called, we didn't have the room, and Haven House is the only shelter in the tri-county area that accepts men with their children. We referred him to the American Red Cross Emergency program until he could get into Haven House.

After coming to Haven House, we helped arrange transportation for his daughter to get back and forth to school. She also took part in our Tutoring/Mentor program which helped her stay current in her classes and with her homework. Frank continued to find it difficult to find work. He became very depressed. Staff was able to suggest some services that would help him deal with his depression as well as help him and his daughter deal with their grief. In addition, we were able to find ways to help him feel valued and stay motivated and focused on his short-term and long-term goals. It was a challenge, but both he and the staff worked as hard as they could. Eventually, Frank was able to find work and housing. The look of accomplishment on Frank's face was indescribable by words. It was great day.

Frank and his daughter have moved into housing and are now part of our Partner's in Progress Transitional program.
